Through the "Invest in Kids Act," Illinois children enrolled in private schools will have access to new scholarships. The scholarships offered through this program could cover 50 to 100 percent of tuition and eligible charges for next school year. Key information about the program and application process is available on the diocesan website (cdop.org) and select CATHOLIC EDUCATION. Applications are being accepted as soon as December and scholarships will be awarded on a first come, first serve basis starting January 24, 2018, so it is very important to act quickly!

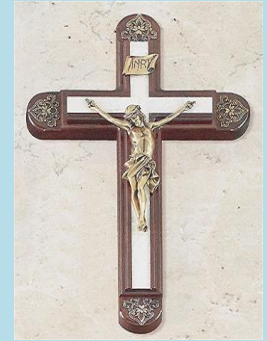
